



An Ecumenical Conference entitled 'One Lord, One Faith' was held in the Church of St John the Baptist, Clontarf on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> June, commemorating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in

Germany. Introducing the event, Mary Cunningham, co-organiser with the Rector, the Revd Lesley Robinson, highlighted the many and growing list of ecumenical initiatives in Clontarf, including a Good Friday Way of the Cross, an Easter Sunrise Service, the Pentecost Camino and Ecumenical Bible Study. The conference was ably facilitated by Philip McKinley, who commented on the power of anniversaries as opportunities to think wide and think big and to look again through our 2017 lens at what life was like in the 16th century. The first speaker was Dr Gesa Thiessen, spoke of the background to the Reformation and gave an insight into Luther's theology. The second speaker, Dr Andrew Pierce, reflected on the Ecumenical Journey So Far. Fr Gabriel Daly OSA, followed with a talk entitled An Ecumenical Theology of the Eucharist, and Gillian Kingston, wrapped things up with some thoughts on where we can go from here, in a talk entitled Stepping Stones Towards Greater Unity. # St. Gabriel's Notes

### CHILE

I was privileged to be part of a study group to visit Chile with some fifteen Dublin priests, a deacon and his wife. The aim of the visit was to learn about the Chilean Church and the contribution the Columbans and volunteer Dublin priests made to the Church in Chile over the past forty years.

We were told of the coup d'état in 1973 and human rights violations under Pinochet when thousands of people were tortured and many "disappeared". We visited the **Museo de la Memoria y los Derechos Humanos** (Museum of Memory and Human Rights) which recounted those tortured, killed and "disappeared". This was followed by a visit to the **Villa Grimaldi** where many people were tortured and killed. With this background we had a most inspiring talk from **Mariana Aylwin**, whose father replaced Pinochet in 1990. She herself is a politician and served for a time as Minister for Education. She told us how the Chilean people did not lose hope during the Pinochet regime and the great support the Catholic Church was to the people.

We also met with the Cardinal Archbishop of Santiago, **Ricardo Andrello** where seven million Catholics live in 213 Parishes. Serving these are 230 Diocesan priests (50 retired and 25 in nursing homes). There are 360 married deacons and 246 Religious. Like Ireland, there is a great fall-off in numbers going to Church.

Next we visited some Columban parishes. Fr. John Greene (a volunteer priest from Dublin) showed us his parish, St. Matthew's, which has sixty thousand Catholics in nine different Churches, served by two priests, four deacons and five sisters. We sat in on a First Holy Communion meeting. It is a two-year programme where parents meet with a Catechist weekly and the children also have weekly classes. The children are about nine or ten when they receive their First Holy Communion and Confirmation is administered to young people when they are fifteen or sixteen.

On Sunday some of us went to Mass in St. Columbanus' Parish, where we received a very warm welcome. The different churches in the Parish came together for a wonderful celebration with traditional music. The Mass was followed by traditional dancing and a reception in the Church. Some went to Fr. John Greene's parish for two Masses in different communities (very few attending).

We also went on pilgrimage to the Shrine of St. Teresa of the Andes – the patron Saint of Chile – the equivalent of our Knock. We met with lay missionaries working with Columbans and visited a Mission House where they run retreats.

Our final day was with the Columbans in their main house – starting with an outdoor Mass in thanksgiving for the number of Dublin priests who have worked with the Columbans over the past forty years – Fr. Chris Mangan who was in St. Gabriel's was one of the first Dublin Priests to volunteer.

I came home exhausted from the trip but enriched greatly. The Chilean Church is suffering as we are here with the drop in numbers and the increasing age profile of both priests and people. But they have a great sense of hope. Also with the scarcity of priests the people are taking more responsibility for their parish communities. A very worthwhile trip, and my thanks to my fellow travellers, our host Fr. John Green and the Columbans for making it so special.


