



the few devoted members kept a constant watch over the sea, and with no thought for themselves went out day and night tirelessly searching for the lost. Some of those who were saved, and various others in the surrounding area, wanted to become associated with the station and give their time and money and effort for the support of its work. New boats were bought and new crews trained. The little life-saving station grew.

Some of the members of the life-saving station were unhappy that the building was so crude and poorly equipped. They felt that a more comfortable place should be provided as the first refuge of those saved from the sea. They replaced the emergency cots with beds and put better furniture in the enlarged building.

Now the life-saving station became a popular gathering place for its members, and they decorated it as sort of a club. Fewer members were now interested in going to sea on life-saving missions, so they hired lifeboat crews to do this work. The life-saving motif still prevailed in this club's decoration, and there was a liturgical lifeboat in the room where the club initiations were held.

About this time a large ship was wrecked off the coast, and the hired crews brought in boatloads of cold, wet and half-drowned people. They were dirty and sick and some had black skin and some had yellow skin. The beautiful new club was in chaos. So the property committee immediately had a shower house built outside the club where victims of shipwrecks could be cleaned up before coming inside.

At the next meeting, there was a split in the club membership. Most of the members wanted to stop the club's life-saving activities as being unpleasant and a hindrance to the normal social life of the club. Some members insisted upon life-saving as their primary purpose and pointed out that they were still called a life-saving station. But they were finally voted down and told that if they wanted to save lives of all the various kinds of people who were shipwrecked in those waters, they could begin their own life-saving station down the coast. So they did just that.

As the years went by, the new station experienced the same changes that had occurred in the old. It evolved into a club, and yet another 'spin-off' life saving station was founded. History continued to repeat itself, and if you visit the sea coast today, you will find a number of exclusive clubs along the shore. Shipwrecks are frequent in those waters, but most of the people drown."

Is there a danger that our Churches have become "Exclusive Clubs" and are losing our Life Saving Mission?

Looking Forward

When the youngest of a large family finally heads away to college, the father might remark to the mother; "Now we're back where we started". He is right in one way - once again there is just the two of them. On the other hand, however, he may be wrong, because they are in no way like the young couple who had many years earlier entered together into the shared venture that is marriage.

One of the sayings regularly mentioned to couples getting married is the importance of give and take; the theory being that over the course of the marriage the giving and the taking will more or less equalise. This saying can also apply to the joint venture that is parenthood, except, that in this case, it might seem that the giving is done by the parents, and the taking, or, in early years at least, the receiving, is done by the child. But if we look more closely we realise that the unconditional love given by parents is matched by the unconditional trust given, even if unconsciously, by the child. And that trust is a gift beyond measure.

Trust confers responsibility. Parental loving is a bit like the sun shining - it shines because it is what it does, and parents love because it is what they do. But the unconditional nature of the child's trust can be fragile, and trust itself can be eroded. It must be earned, otherwise it To maintain that trust is a lifelong challenge that requires unselfishness, humour, courage and patience....(and a thick skin!)




