Understanding the roots of our faith

Two lecturers from the School of Theology in Dublin City University are coming to our parish to speak to us the roots of our faith in Judaism and the early Church. On Wednesday, 3rd April, Dr Brad Anderson, lecturer in Biblical Studies, will speak on Judaism, Christianity and the Old Testament, at 7.30 pm in our Parish Centre, and on Wednesday, 10th April, Dr Joseph Rivera, lecturer in Theology, will speak on The Story of the Early Church, at 7.30 pm in our Parish Centre.

Sale of presbytery, 187 Clontarf Road

The Diocese has purchased 187 Clontarf Road from the parish at the cost of €761,500. We have now paid Saint Anthony's parish €250,000 off our debt of €600,000. Their Finance Committee have agreed that the remainder of the loan, €350,000 will be interest free. This will save our parish €12,000 a year. The remainder of the money we received for the sale of the presbytery. €511,500, has gone into a newly opened parish account and will be used to fund the upcoming work on the church. Fr Martin
