Sunday Mass numbers in the three Clontarf churches




Roster for Stewards

Arrangements for Holy Communion

One of the challenges of the new reality is arranging for people to receive Holy Communion in a way that maintains social distance for all. We would ask those who occupy the central place in each seat to come forward to receive a blessing if you are not receiving Holy Communion. Otherwise, some of those coming to Communion in the seat will have to cross over the person in the central position and social distancing is not maintained. The celebrant will be at the top of the main aisle and the Minister of the Eucharist will be inside the inside door of the church. facing up the church. We would ask that those on the right side of the church, Our Lady's side, would come to Communion first. Those in the Gallery are asked to stay in their seats and the Minister of the Eucharist will bring you Holy Communion.
