We are holding off on starting back the film club for the moment, due to Government restrictions on the numbers who can gather indoors. However, we will review the situation after the next Government announcement for the way forward, which is due shortly.

Work on our Parish Church

I think you will agree that the east side of the church, facing Vernon Avenue, is looking very well (Phase 3). Work has now commenced on Phase 4, which is the back of the church. However, in this phase, our funds only allow us to do the outside work on the walls and windows. We will also have to forego Phase 5, which is the sacristy/parish office area. The total cost for the work was higher than envisaged, because of unforeseen problems. As a result, we have had to borrow money from our neighbouring parishes. I would like to express my gratitude to Fr. Larry and the Finance Committee of Saint Anthony's parish for an interest free loan of €250.000. We will pay back the capital sum at a rate of €1,000 per month, beginning this month. Saint Gabriel's parish are selling a presbytery, and Fr Pat and his Finance Committee have promised us an interest free loan of €300,000 from the sale. They are not requiring us to pay back the capital sum. Without these considerable funds from our sister parishes, we would not have been able to complete Phase 3 or to do the outside work in Phase 4. It is an expression of inter parish co-operation at its best. Fr Martin
