New chapel dedicated to Saint Patrick in Belarus A beautiful new Chapel was

officially opened on the grounds of Vesnova Children's Mental Institution in Belarus last month, in honour of the Irish volunteers attached to Chernobyl Children

International. This unique Chapel, the first of its kind to be dedicated to the people of Ireland in Belarus, has been named 'Saint Patrick's Chapel', in recognition of the Irish volunteers, many of whom have been travelling to Vesnova for over 25 years.

Clothing Appeal for Fr William Stuart in Lebanon As many of you are aware, Fr William Stuart, a native of

Clontarf, has set up a school for

Syrian refugee children living in Southern Lebanon. Because of this school, these children receive a basic education they otherwise would not get. They are living in tents, lacking the basic amenities we take for granted. Fr William is hoping that the three Clontarf parishes will contribute to a clothing collection for the children. He is looking for clothing for boys and girls aged between 3 and 16 including shoes (tied together with a label indicating size); hats and scarfs; towels and underwear. Personal toiletries are also very welcome, such as soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, dental floss, hair brushes, sponges, sanitary towels and other personal hygiene materials. It would be very helpful if the items could be labelled according to item, age and gender (e.g. trousers, age 6/7, boys). All the items will be brought to Lebanon in a large container lorry towards the end of the Summer. Items can be left in Saint John the Baptist Parish Centre, on

Saturday, 19th and 26th June, between 9.30 and 11.30 am.
