Feast of the Week: Saint Monica, 27th August

Next Friday, 27th August, is the feast of Saint Monica, the mother of St Augustine. She was born in North Africa in the year 332. Her husband lived a very immoral life. However, Monica's persistent witness to her faith eventually won him over and he was baptized a year before he died. Her son, Augustine, was an even bigger challenge. She turned to prayer and fasting on his behalf, hoping that they might succeed where arguments had failed. Augustine's spiritual search lead him to Rome and then on to Milan. Monica followed her son, and it was in Milan that he announced to her that he wanted to become a Christian. After Augustine's baptism, Monica set out with him on the journey back to North Africa, but she died on the way, at Ostia, the port of Rome.

World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation and Season of Creation

Wednesday, 1st September, is the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. The day is inspired by Pope Francis' landmark encyclical *Laudato Si'*.
