Feast of Saint Laurence O'Toole

This Sunday, 14th

He is the principal patron

born in Castledermot, Co. Kildare, in 1123 and became a monk at Glendalough and later its abbot in 1148. In 1162 he was chosen as the first native Archbishop of Dublin. As Archbishop, he lived simply and returned to Glendalough every Lent. He was a caring pastor of the Diocese and held various synods to reform the life of the church. He worked for peace and reconciliation and died on a mission of mediation between King Henry II and the Irish rulers in Eu, Normandy, in 1180.
