Born in County Waterford of noble and Christian parents, she founded a monastery in Killeedy, County Limerick, which attracted a great variety of young people. She died in 570.

#### Lighting of Statue of Our Lady at end of **Bull Wall**

Congratulations to one of our Ministers of the Eucharist, Roisín Kelly, for her successful efforts over the Covid pandemic to have the lighting repaired on the statue of Our Lady, Star



of the Sea, at the end of the Bull Wall. The statue was sculpted by Wicklow artist Cecil King and erected in 1972. Soaring 70ft into the air, it faces unusually towards the port, whose workers paid for it. The globe on which she stands rests on three pillars made of white cement and crushed Connemara marble. Our Lady's halo, added six years later, is made of 12 stars provided by Waterford Glass and was manufactured by John Paul & Co Ltd free of charge. Her next mission is to get the stars lighting again!
