Pilgrimage to the Holy Land

The dates of the pilgrimage are from Friday, 21st October, to Saturday, 29th October. We spend four nights in Jerusalem and then four nights in Galilee. The flights are Dublin to Tel Aviv via Istanbul. The price is €1945 per person sharing, which includes Dinner, Bed and Breakfast, transfers and coaching, services of an English speaking Christian guide and entrance fees. **To secure a place you will need to send a deposit of €350 with a booking form to GTI Travel in the next few days.** Payment can be made by debit or credit card or cheque made payable to **GTI Travel**.
