First phase of the implementation of the Building Hope Task Force Report

Last Summer the new Archbishop set up a Task Force to look at the pastoral needs in the Diocese of Dublin in the coming years and how best to respond to them. The Task Force produced a report, entitled Building *Hope*, which outlined a pastoral strategy for the Diocese into the future. The first phase of the *Building Hope* Implementation is taking place in parishes from Easter Sunday to the feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord. This will involve holding a Parish Gathering to explore what is working well in our parish and what needs to be improved, and also to look at which three, four or five parishes would make good sense for us as a parish to be in local partnership with. Our Parish Gathering is on Tuesday, 17th May, in the Holy Faith Hall. In preparation for this meeting, each parish has been provided with parish profile material, which you are asked to look over. It is available on the table in the front porch of the church in the form of two sides of an A4 sheet.
