This Monday, July 11, is the feast of Saint Benedict. He was born of a distinguished family and was educated in Rome. He abandoned his studies and his inheritance and he devoted himself to the quest for God. This initially took the form of a period of solitude in a cave just to the east of Rome. His solitude was interrupted by those who were drawn to his way of life and wanted to gather around him. He organized these followers into a group of monasteries. He himself took leadership of one of those monasteries, Monte Casino, which is now considered the birthplace of the Benedictine order. There he wrote his Monastic Rule which set a standard for the future Western Monastic tradition.
