### **Season of Creation**

St Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of Ecology and the founder of the Franciscan Order is given due prominence in 'Laudato Si'. The title itself-which means 'praise be to you'-is taken from the opening line of the Canticle of the Sun. This beautiful hymn of praise was composed by St Francis in 1224 and in it he reminds us of the interconnected and independent relationship we have with all of God's creation.
